“Raise the Roof”

Yes, the pastoral article in this issue of The Communicator is about the “Raise the Roof!” campaign again!

I wrestled with that as I considered what message the congregation most needed to hear about in this bi-weekly missive. A letter announcing the campaign, the mailing of the campaign booklet, e-mail reminders, letters yet-to-come, and newsletter articles every issue between March and May? Isn't that overkill?

But then I have to respond that these three months will affect the life of our church building and grounds for years to come. To not pay off our existing debt, or replace the roof when the consequence would be catastrophic, or do all that we can to improve building drainage? Unthinkable! And while we're at it—if only to avoid more appeals later—why not include some of those other projects we're got on our “to do” list in one comprehensive campaign? This is the most important thing I've got to convey!

Someone commented to me last week, “This church has given me three once-in-a-lifetime opportunities in the last decade!” I couldn't tell whether the smile on his face masked a bit of sarcasm, but I responded nevertheless, “Yes, you are truly blessed!”

The “Together We Grow” campaign to purchase the property next door was, indeed, an opportunity that would never come our way again if we let it pass by; we air-conditioned the sanctuary and protected stained glass windows with the funds left over after the purchase.

The “Venture in Faith” campaign gave us the chance to rid our building of asbestos, give the 1955 unit a complete make-over, improve lighting in the sanctuary, and (oh, yes) add a warm and inviting frontage on Lincoln Way with beautiful new spaces. Most church-goers in other places never get the opportunity to improve their church homes to this degree.

Now, I've never referred to the “Raise the Roof!” campaign as a “once-in-a-lifetime” thing. (Plenty of people remember the last re-roofing, in 1986, and those who are still with us fifty years from now will have the chance again!) But it is essential, or there might not be a sanctuary to re-roof somewhere down the road.

So hang in there for a couple more months, pray about your level of participation in the campaign, and celebrate the many blessings this campaign will achieve for us if we each do our part!

Not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice!

Having said that, please remember these important dates: Tuesday, **April 12**, and Sunday, **April 17** at 7:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall: Informational Meetings

The C/W Finance Committee will have desserts available for this one-hour meeting as you hear from fellow C/W laypersons talk about the projects of the campaign. You will have the opportunity to ask questions. Kevin Gowdy, Executive Director of the Iowa United Methodist Foundation, will be present to give a brief presentation on “Creative Ways to Give to the Campaign.” If your take-home pay or pension payment makes things tight, Kevin will have a host of other ideas of ways to consider giving so that our goals can be achieved. Both meetings will have the same format, so you needn’t attend twice—unless you want to hear the information again, think of more questions, or just like dessert!

Easter Sunday, **April 24**: 8:30 & 11:00 worship services, *faithspring*: Early Commitment Announcement.

A number of congregation members (10-20% of our households) are making early commitments to the campaign, to give us a head start to reaching the goal. The announcement of this initial amount will be made at Easter Sunday worship services.

Sunday, **May 8** (Festival of the Christian Home): 8:30 & 11:00 worship services: “Raise the Roof!” Day.

The Festival of the Christian Home is an appropriate day to receive other commitments to the campaign. Commitment Cards will be mailed out the week before Raise the Roof! Day (additional cards will be available in worship); hopefully, households will have taken time to pray and discern the level of their participation. During the early part of the service, the cards will be received during a Ritual of Dedication, and the Campaign Total will be announced at the end of the service. (Though we will continue to receive cards after that day, of course, we hope to reach the campaign goal of \$1 million.)

Do your part to share the hope as we draw closer to Raise the Roof Sunday!

“News from the Discipleship Director”

It is with great excitement and regret that I am announcing my resignation at Collegiate/Wesley. The excitement stems from the fact that my lovely and talented wife, Dr. LeAnn Faidley, has accepted a job at Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa. The regret comes from the fact that we will be leaving Ames.

Many people don't know the story of how I came to Collegiate/Wesley. In a way, I didn't find this position; it found me. In the summer of 2008, my wife (then fiancé) had started working at ISU while I was still in Columbus, Ohio, serving as a campus minister in a congregation next to Ohio State



University. One of my congregants, who served as a United Methodist historian, knew I was planning to move to Ames. While attending a national gathering of UM historians in Iowa, he heard a presentation about the Wesley Foundations by Rev. Scott Grotewold. After the presentation, he asked Scott if he knew of any church in Iowa that was hiring. Scott mentioned that the church he served (Collegiate/Wesley) was seeking applicants for a position that would consist of communications, technology, and discipleship; did this "Wil Ranney" have any skills in those areas? Though it seems like this is random occurrence, every single one of my ministry positions have developed this way. That's why even as I regret to inform you about my departure, I know that God will use me in my new endeavors, and I know God will continue to provide for Collegiate/Wesley in my absence.

It has been an honor and a pleasure to get to know and serve with the people of Collegiate/Wesley. You will be missed. I hope that the many programs I've established will continue to bear fruit in the coming years. Because I am still seeking ordination as a Deacon I will maintain my membership here, so you can expect to see me around from time to time.

I endeavor to help churches embolden their online ministries as a freelance minister while in Waverly. There is no official date set yet, but our transition will likely occur between May and August.
